INTRODUCTION

- 1. California Rural Legal Assistance, Inc. ("CRLA") files this Petition pursuant to the California Public Records Act (Gov. Code, § 7920.000 et seq.) to compel the California Department of Food and Agriculture ("CDFA") to disclose various records related to outbreaks of H5N1, an avian influenza virus, in California dairies.
- 2. Throughout 2024 and 2025, H5N1 (a.k.a. "bird flu") has spread in California dairies, killing thousands of cows, sickening dozens of dairy workers, and jeopardizing public health. As an organization dedicated to advancing agricultural workers' rights, CRLA has engaged in extensive outreach to distribute personal protective equipment ("PPE") to dairy workers and educate dairy workers about the risks of bird flu and their rights as workers who may be exposed to the virus. Through this work, CRLA seeks to protect dairy workers, their communities, and the broader public from H5N1.
- 3. In December 2024, California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency in response to H5N1, stating his intention that all "Californians have access to accurate, up-to-date information" about the disease. CDFA, nonetheless, has refused to provide the public with critical information related to the spread of H5N1—including any details about the locations it has placed under quarantine due to bird flu outbreaks. Prompt disclosure of quarantine locations would allow CRLA and other members of the public to effectively target outreach and education to at-risk workers and communities and better understand and respond to a dangerous disease. CDFA's refusal to disclose the locations of H5N1 outbreaks has stifled such critical bird flu prevention and research efforts.
- 4. In addition to jeopardizing public health, CDFA's refusal to disclose the locations of bird flu outbreaks has perpetuated a stark and unjustifiable information asymmetry: CDFA and dairy producers know where and when bird flu outbreaks are occurring; CRLA, dairy workers, and the broader public do not. In January 2025, in a bid to remedy this asymmetry, CRLA submitted a request to CDFA under the California Public Records Act ("PRA") for records related to dairy operations placed under quarantine due to H5N1 infections in cattle, including lists the agency maintains of dairies under quarantine. Instead of promptly processing this request and disclosing

the requested records, however, CDFA spent nearly the next seven months delaying its responses to CRLA, refusing to reveal its quarantine lists, and ultimately producing records which were redacted beyond usability.

- 5. Because zoonotic diseases like avian influenza can spread to cattle from birds and other animals, California dairies will likely continue to be impacted by H5N1 and/or similar viruses which can infect dairy workers, become transmissible between humans, and potentially cause an acute public health crisis. The dangers posed by H5N1 to dairy workers—and by extension the public at large—can be significantly reduced through education, research, PPE use, sanitation protocols, limitations on contact with infected animals and animal products, and other protective behaviors, many of which are required by state occupational safety and health regulations. To ensure such measures are being taken, however, it is vital to know which dairies are impacted by H5N1 outbreaks. CDFA is the only state agency empowered to gather such information, so it is paramount that CDFA complies with the PRA and releases records that will help civil society respond effectively to a potent threat.
- 6. The records sought by CRLA would facilitate crucial dairy worker outreach and education efforts, bolster compliance with California law, and allow scientists to advance public health research, among other salubrious outcomes which flow from upholding the public's right to access information gathered by public agencies. Accordingly, CRLA asks this Court to order CDFA to comply with its obligations under the PRA and the California Constitution by producing the records requested, in their entirety and without further delay.

PARTIES

- 7. Petitioner CRLA is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit law firm headquartered in Modesto, California, with offices located throughout California. Since 1966, CRLA has provided legal services at no cost to qualifying low-income individuals, especially agricultural workers. CRLA is a member of the public, as defined by Government Code sections 7920.515 and 7920.520.
- 8. Respondent CDFA is a California state agency headquartered in Sacramento, California. CDFA is a public agency, as defined by Government Code sections 7920.525 and 7920.540.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 9. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter under article I, section 3 of the California Constitution; article VI, section 10 of the California Constitution; Government Code section 7923.000; and Code of Civil Procedure sections 1060 and 1085.
- 10. Venue is proper in Sacramento County under Government Code section 7923.100 and Code of Civil Procedure section 395 because, on information and belief, all the records at issue in this matter are in the possession of Respondent CDFA in Sacramento County, where the agency is headquartered.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

I. Public Health Dangers Posed by H5N1

- 11. In recent years, variants of the H5N1 strain of avian influenza have spread rapidly throughout the world, mainly infecting birds and non-human mammals. (Lowen et al., *Controlling bird flu is urgent—for dairy, wildlife, poultry, pets, and people*, Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association (June 25, 2025).)¹ H5N1 is a zoonotic aerosol transmissible disease ("ATD"), meaning infected animals can spread the virus to humans through the air and via bodily fluids, including their milk. (Campbell et al., *mGem: Transmission and exposure risks of dairy cow H5N1 influenza virus*, mBio (Feb. 11, 2025).)²
- 12. Avian influenza viruses can mutate and/or combine with other viruses to become more resistant to eradication, more transmissible, and/or more fatal. A single mutation within H5N1's genome could enable it to spread between humans. (Rust, *Just one mutation can make H5N1 bird flu a threat to humans, California researchers say*, Los Angeles Times (Dec. 5, 2024).)³
- 13. H5N1 is often lethal. Out of 990 human H5N1 infections reported to the World Health Organization since 2003, 475—48%—have resulted in death. (*Cumulative number of*

confirmed human cases for avian influenza A(H5N1) reported to WHO, 2003-2025, 25 August 2025, World Health Organization (Aug. 25, 2025).)⁴

- 14. There is a significant risk that H5N1 could cause a major public health emergency, and there is much that public health researchers and virologists have yet to learn about the disease. (Lowen et al., *Pandemic risk stemming from the bovine H5N1 outbreak: an account of the knowns and unknowns*, Journal of Virology (Feb. 27, 2025).)⁵
- 15. Humans who work near cows infected with H5N1 are at high risk of contracting the disease. (Dhillon et al., *Steps to prevent and respond to an H5N1 epidemic in the USA*, Nature Medicine (Apr. 2025).)⁶ Dairy workers can protect themselves from H5N1 infections, though, by wearing PPE (such as gloves, respirators, aprons, face shields, and eye goggles); minimizing close contact with dead and infected animals; and adhering to rigorous sanitation protocols. (Bartlett et al., *Enhancing the response to avian influenza in the US and globally*, The Lancet Regional Health Americas (June 2025).)⁷
- 16. On March 25, 2024, the U.S. Department of Agriculture ("USDA") announced H5N1 had jumped from wild birds to cows in Texas and Kansas dairy herds. (*Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza H5N1 Genotype B3.13 in Dairy Cattle: National Epidemiologic Brief*, USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (Sep. 24, 2024).)⁸ The virus soon began infecting cattle and dairy workers throughout the United States. (Maxmen, *How America Lost Control of the Bird Flu, Setting the Stage for Another Pandemic*, KFF Health News (Dec. 20, 2024).)⁹
- 17. On August 30, 2024, CDFA announced it had placed three California dairies under quarantine due to H5N1 infections. (*HIGHLY PATHOGENIC AVIAN INFLUENZA (HPAI) CONFIRMED IN THREE CALIFORNIA DAIRY HERDS*, CDFA (Aug. 30, 2024).)¹⁰ Since then,

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H5N1 has impacted hundreds of California dairies and dozens of California dairy workers exposed to sick cows have fallen ill with the virus. (Zhu et al., *Human Cases of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza A(H5N1)* — *California, September–December 2024*, CDC Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (Mar. 13, 2025).)¹¹

II. State Agencies' Powers to Prevent the Spread of Zoonotic Diseases

18. In California, three state agencies are primarily charged with responding to zoonotic diseases like H5N1. CDFA is responsible for investigating outbreaks and preventing the spread of diseases between animals. (Food & Agr. Code, § 9531.) The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health ("Cal/OSHA") is responsible for protecting California workers from occupational hazards, (Lab. Code, § 6309), including infections from diseases carried by animals in their workplaces. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 8, § 5199.1.) And the California Department of Public Health ("CDPH"), in coordination with local health departments, is tasked with testing for, tracking, and treating communicable diseases. (Health & Saf. Code, §§ 120125, 120140, 120175.)

19. CDFA is required to maintain a public List of Reportable Conditions for Animals and Animal Products ("Reportable Conditions List"), which compiles conditions that "may pose significant threats to public health, animal health, the environment, or the food supply." (Food & Agr. Code, § 9101, subd. (a); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 3, § 797, subd. (b).) CDFA is often the first agency to become aware of zoonotic disease outbreaks because licensed veterinarians and other animal health professionals in California are required to report to CDFA when they suspect an animal has been affected by any condition on the Reportable Conditions List. (Food & Agr. Code, § 9101, subd. (b); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 3, § 797, subd. (d).) At least as of September 2024, "[h]ighly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) H5N1 virus in livestock" has been included on CDFA's Reportable Conditions List, under the heading "EMERGENCY CONDITIONS / Report within 24 Hours of Discovery." (LIST OF REPORTABLE CONDITIONS FOR ANIMALS AND ANIMAL PRODUCTS, CDFA – Animal Health Branch (Sep. 2024).)¹²

- 20. Not only does CDFA have broad authority to investigate suspected outbreaks of zoonotic diseases, including the power to "enter any premises and inspect any animal," (Food & Agr. Code, § 9531; see also Food & Agr. Code, §§ 32731, 33321), it has the obligation to impose a quarantine if the State Veterinarian believes an infected population of animals "could transmit an illness that could kill or seriously damage other animals or humans." (Food & Agr. Code, § 9562, subd. (a); see also Food & Agr. Code, §§ 9562, subd. (b)(3) and 10610, subd. (a).)
- California's occupational safety and health zoonotic ATD standard requires, at baseline, that employers, including dairy owners, "establish, implement, and maintain effective procedures for preventing employee exposure to zoonotic aerosol transmissible pathogens." (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 8, § 5199.1, subd. (a)(2)(A).) And when "CDFA issues a quarantine order, movement restriction, or other infection control order applicable to an establishment due to an increased risk of zoonotic [ATD] infection," the zoonotic ATD standard requires employers to implement additional employee protections, including: identifying and marking restricted areas; supervising employees in the restricted areas and providing them with appropriate PPE, respiratory protection, and means of sanitation; providing employees with recommended medical services; maintaining records of entry to restricted areas; and providing employees with appropriate training. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 8, § 5199.1, subd. (c).) Compliance with the zoonotic ATD standard significantly reduces the risk of transmission of zoonotic diseases, such as H5N1, from dairy cows to humans.

III. Bird Flu Outbreaks in California Dairies

- 22. Throughout late 2024 and 2025, H5N1 has spread rapidly throughout California dairy and poultry farms—especially in the Central San Joaquin Valley, home to most of the state's more than 1,000 dairies—leading to the deaths of thousands of cows and millions of birds.
- 23. By early October 2024, California dairy workers began to fall ill with bird flu infections, while dead cows were piled along roadways in the Central Valley. (Klein, *Photos of dead cattle show bird flu is overwhelming Tulare County. How did the virus get in?*, KVPR (Oct.

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11, 2024).)¹³ Nonetheless, CDFA refused to publicly disclose even the counties in which it had confirmed dairy herd infections. (Rust, 'More serious than we had hoped': Bird flu deaths mount among California dairy cows, Los Angeles Times (Oct. 4, 2024).)¹⁴ By the end of October 2024, 16 out of 39 Californians screened by local health officials for H5N1 had tested positive for the virus. (Hwang, Bird flu jumped from cows to people. Now advocates want more farmworkers tested, CalMatters (Oct. 30, 2024).)15

- 24. On November 21, 2024, the Santa Clara County Department of Public Health discovered and announced that raw milk sold by a Fresno-based dairy contained the H5N1 virus. (Rust, Bird flu virus detected in California raw milk, Los Angeles Times (Nov. 24, 2024).) 16 Soon thereafter, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health publicized the names of nearly 50 stores that might have sold the contaminated milk. (Rust, Did you buy raw milk at one of these stores? Another recall issued for tainted California milk, Los Angeles Times (Nov. 27, 2024).)¹⁷ CDFA subsequently placed the dairy under quarantine. (Rust, All raw milk from Fresno dairy farm will be cleared from store shelves; cows have bird flu, Los Angeles Times (Dec. 4, 2024).)¹⁸
- 25. Even as the spread and severity of H5N1 became more apparent, some dairies placed under quarantine failed to train their employees in bird flu prevention or provide their employees with PPE and other protections. (Rust & Gomez, Despite warnings from bird flu experts, it's business as usual in California dairy country, Los Angeles Times (Nov. 26, 2024).)¹⁹
- 26. On December 6, 2024, USDA announced a National Milk Testing Strategy to combat the spread of bird flu nationwide, mandating that dairies and other businesses handling raw milk cooperate with USDA in testing for and reporting the presence of H5N1. (Rust, USDA says it

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materials and trainings for dairy workers. These materials and trainings explained, among other matters, dairy workers' rights to take paid sick leave, receive free testing for H5N1 from local health departments, make confidential health and safety complaints to Cal/OSHA, and receive bird flu prevention training and PPE from their employers.

- 36. Throughout late 2024 and 2025, CRLA staff conducted dairy worker outreach and education events in Fresno, Tulare, Kings, Merced, and Stanislaus counties; appeared on Spanish-language radio and television programs to discuss H5N1; presented to community groups about bird flu; and distributed hundreds of bags containing PPE and KYR materials at stores, vendor stalls, and housing complexes. CRLA staff conducted their outreach in areas they knew or believed to be home to many dairy workers. Nonetheless, without any idea which of the hundreds of dairies in the Central Valley were under quarantine, CRLA staff could not effectively focus their efforts in the communities at most immediate risk from H5N1.
- 37. To better inform at-risk dairy workers of their rights, and to protect public health more broadly, on January 24, 2025, CRLA submitted a PRA Request (the "Request") to CDFA via email, seeking "records maintained by CDFA relating to dairy operations currently or recently placed under quarantine by the state due to H5N1 bird flu cattle infections/exposures." A true and correct copy of CRLA's January 24 Request is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

V. CDFA's Failures to Comply with the California Public Records Act

- 38. CDFA acknowledged the Request via email the same day it was submitted, January 24, 2025. A true and correct copy of CDFA's January 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.
- 39. Except as otherwise noted below, correspondence from CDFA to CRLA was not sent by identifiable agency employees.
- 40. CDFA failed to identify whether it possessed any responsive records to the Request within 10 days of its receipt.
- 41. On February 12, 2025, CRLA inquired about the status of the Request. A true and correct copy of CRLA's February 12 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

- 42. On February 14, 2025, CDFA responded that it was "awaiting responsive records" but offered no "estimated expected date of receipt." A true and correct copy of CDFA's February 14 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.
- 43. On February 24, 2025, CRLA reminded CDFA that an initial determination in response to the Request should have been made by February 3, 2025, adding that it was "seeking a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies under bird flu-related quarantine to [advance] the legal rights and wellbeing of dairy workers." A true and correct copy of CRLA's February 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 5.
- 44. On February 26, 2025, CDFA denied the Request, purportedly pursuant to Government Code sections 7923.600 and 7922.000. A true and correct copy of CDFA's February 26 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 6. In its denial, CDFA claimed "records related to an open investigation are exempt from disclosure" and "that the public interest served by not disclosing records related to ongoing H5N1 cattle infection investigations clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure." (Exhibit 6.)
- 45. On March 6, 2025, CRLA requested that CDFA reconsider its denial, explaining why Government Code sections 7923.600 and 7922.000 could not justify withholding the records it sought. A true and correct copy of CRLA's March 6 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 7.
- 46. On March 12, 2025, CDFA acknowledged CRLA's March 6 request for reconsideration and, without responding to the arguments CRLA presented, asked for "the 'specific type' of record that you are seeking" to "assist staff in locating and retrieving the records you seek." A true and correct copy of CDFA's March 12 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 8.
- 47. On March 13, 2025, CRLA responded that it was "happy to work with CDFA to clarify and narrow" the Request, again stated that it was "seeking a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies under bird flu-related quarantine," and added: "Ideally, such documents would also indicate the dates dairies have entered and been released from quarantine, and any data on the number of cows and/or people infected with H5N1." A true and correct copy of CRLA's March 13 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 9.

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- 48. On March 14, 2025, CDFA asked: "Are you requesting records related to dairies under active quarantine or diaries [sic] that have been released from quarantine?" and "Is there a specific timeframe for the records you are seeking?" A true and correct copy of CDFA's March 14 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 10.
- 49. On March 17, 2025, CRLA responded by narrowing its Request "to all dairies that are under active quarantine or that have been released from quarantine in the last two months," specified that "time is of the essence with this request," and requested rolling production of records based on geographic priorities. A true and correct copy of CRLA's March 17 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 11.
- 50. On March 24, 2025, after a week with no response, CRLA asked CDFA for an "anticipated timeline for production." A true and correct copy of CRLA's March 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 12. Later that day, CDFA again stated it had "no expected date of receipt currently." A true and correct copy of CDFA's March 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 13.
- 51. On March 25, 2025, CRLA reminded CDFA of several of its obligations under the PRA, including deciding whether it possesses disclosable records within 10 days of receiving a PRA request and providing the requester with an estimated date and time for release. A true and correct copy of CRLA's March 25 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 14. CRLA also repeated its request for rolling production of records related to the dairies most recently placed under quarantine and raised the possibility of suing the agency to compel disclosure. (Exhibit 14.)
- 52. On March 28, 2025—nine weeks after CRLA made the Request—CDFA "confirmed that the Department has responsive, disclosable records" related to CRLA's request for "copies of a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies that are under active quarantine or that have been released from quarantine in the last two months." A true and correct copy of CDFA's March 28 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 15. CDFA added that, "[d]ue to the large volume of records anticipated to be received," it would "release the first batch of responsive records by April 30, 2025." (Exhibit 15.)

- 53. On April 2, 2025, CRLA expressed its hope that "the core of the request—a list or lists of dairies under active quarantine—can be fulfilled without much effort," and advised CDFA that it intended "this to be a rolling request" for "relevant records as the dairy quarantine situation changes in the coming weeks and months." A true and correct copy of CRLA's April 2 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 16.
 - 54. CDFA did not respond to CRLA's April 2 correspondence.
- 55. On May 2, 2025, CDFA pushed back the anticipated date for the first release of records to May 15, 2025 and again acknowledged that CRLA "requested" copies of a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies that are under active quarantine or that have been released from quarantine in the last two months." A true and correct copy of CDFA's May 2 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 17. That same day, CRLA requested that CDFA prioritize "records related to dairies still under quarantine" and "provide estimated dates of release for subsequent batches of records, along with a description of the documents expected to be included in those releases." A true and correct copy of CRLA's May 2 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 18.
 - 56. CDFA did not respond to CRLA's May 2 correspondence.
- 57. On May 19, 2025, CRLA again requested a status update from CDFA. A true and correct copy of CRLA's May 19 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 19.
- 58. On May 22, 2025—118 days after CRLA sent the Request—CDFA released 214 pages of records, Bates_0001-0214 ("Production 1"). A true and correct copy of CDFA's May 22 correspondence regarding Production 1 is attached hereto as Exhibit 20. Production 1 contained 28 notices served by CDFA on various dairies in December 2024, informing them their animals and animal products had been placed under quarantine; movement restriction instructions associated with all but six of those quarantine imposition orders; photos of one of the quarantine entry notices posted on a doorway; amended quarantine notices for two dairies from January and March 2025; three quarantine release notices from March 24, April 3, and April 10, 2025; an epidemiological assessment associated with one of the April 2025 quarantine release notices; and a report from the Cornell Animal Health Diagnostic Center reporting a bulk milk tank positive sample for Avian H5

Influenza Virus. A representative sample of the records contained in Production 1, Bates_0057 through Bates_0066, is attached hereto as Exhibit 21.

- 59. None of the records in Production 1, or in any subsequent production by CDFA, contained a list or lists of dairies under quarantine or otherwise identified such dairies.
- 60. Throughout Production 1, CDFA redacted the names and locations of the dairies listed on quarantine imposition and release orders. (Exhibit 21.) CDFA stated: "Specific information related to HPAI outbreaks and investigations (including but not limited to the names and contact information of staff, locations of outbreaks, and outbreak location codes) have been redacted pursuant to Government Code section 7922.000, as the Department has made a determination, based on the facts of this particular case, that the public interest served by not disclosing this information clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure." (Exhibit 20.)
- 61. CDFA also redacted most of the names and signatures of agency employees included on the dairy quarantine imposition and release orders in Production 1. (Exhibit 21.) CDFA stated: "Personal identifying information (personal signatures) has been redacted in accordance with Government Code section 7927.400, and Government Code section 7927.700, as disclosure would constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy." (Exhibit 20.) Finally, CDFA indicated that it would release "over 800 records" by June 15, 2025. (*Ibid.*)
- 62. On June 3, 2025, CRLA requested that CDFA "clarify the public interest factors it considered in justifying the name and location redactions, in light of the high bar set by Government Code section 7922.000," reminding the agency it had argued against the applicability of this PRA exception on March 6, 2025. A true and correct copy of CRLA's June 3 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 22. CRLA added: "We are still considering taking this matter to court but remain open to working with the Department, so that CRLA and other organizations can engage in timely and targeted outreach to at-risk dairy workers and communities." (Exhibit 22.)
- 63. On June 4, 2025, CDFA forwarded CRLA's inquiry to "an Attorney here in the Legal Office." A true and correct copy of CDFA's June 4 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 23.

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64. On June 11, 2025, CDFA provided two justifications for its redactions. A true and correct copy of CDFA's June 11 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 24. In its June 11 correspondence, CDFA claimed:

- "HPAI could be intentionally or unintentionally spread to uninfected dairies and poultry producers if the locations of quarantined dairies are released to the public," and that
- "maintaining the confidentiality of dairies infected with HPAI encourages producers to cooperate with both state and federal agencies to contain HPAI. The cooperation of potentially impacted producers and producing farming is greatly enhanced when their farm location is kept confidential." (Exhibit 24.)
- 65. On June 18, 2025, CRLA stated its disagreement with CDFA's justifications and inquired about the delayed release of the second batch of records. A true and correct copy of CRLA's June 18 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 25.
- 66. On July 1, 2025—after nearly two weeks without response—CRLA requested an update and questioned why the lists of locations under quarantine had not yet been produced. A true and correct copy of CRLA's July 1 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 26.
- 67. On July 2, 2025, CDFA again forwarded CRLA's emails to an agency attorney. A true and correct copy of CDFA's July 2 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 27. Later that day, Lynette Komar—the first identifiable agency employee to respond to any of CRLA's correspondence—wrote: "CDFA immediately provides confidential transmission the location of H5N1 Quarantined poultry and dairy facilities to CDPH and/or to Local Public Health." A true and correct copy of Ms. Komar's July 2 correspondence on behalf of CDFA is attached hereto as Exhibit 28.
- 68. On July 10, 2025, CRLA responded to Ms. Komar, highlighting that her response acknowledged CDFA maintains "consolidated lists of locations—and maps—of locations under quarantine." A true and correct copy of CRLA's July 10 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 29.
 - 69. CDFA never responded to CRLA's July 10 correspondence.

- 70. On July 18, 2025, CDFA released a second batch of 819 pages of records, Bates_000215-001033 ("Production 2"). A true and correct copy of CDFA's July 18 correspondence regarding Production 2 is attached hereto as Exhibit 30. Production 2 contained 88 notices served by CDFA on various dairies between August 26, 2024 and March 6, 2025, informing them their animals and animal products had been placed under quarantine; movement restriction instructions associated with all but two of those quarantine imposition orders; three packets of movement restriction instructions not obviously associated with a quarantine imposition notice; three amended quarantine imposition notices; and one epidemiological assessment associated with a quarantine release from April 2025. A representative sample of the records contained in Production 2, Bates_000382 through Bates_000392, is attached hereto as Exhibit 31. CDFA redacted the dairy names and locations, and the names and signatures of some of the agency employees, appearing in Production 2, (Exhibit 31), providing the same justifications it had with respect to its redactions in Production 1. (Exhibit 30.)
- 71. On July 23, 2025, CDFA released a third batch of 801 pages of records, Bates_001033-001833 ("Production 3"). A true and correct copy of CDFA's July 23 correspondence regarding Production 3 is attached hereto as Exhibit 32. Production 3 contained 123 notices served by CDFA on various dairies between September 16, 2024 and March 5, 2025, informing them that their animals and animal products had been placed under quarantine; movement restriction instructions associated with all but 48 of those quarantine imposition orders; one amended quarantine imposition notice; and five epidemiological assessments associated with quarantine releases from March 2025. A representative sample of the records contained in Production 3, Bates_001420 through Bates_001428, is attached hereto as Exhibit 33. CDFA redacted the dairy names and locations, and the names and signatures of some of the agency employees, appearing in Production 3, (Exhibit 33), providing the same justifications that it had with respect to its redactions in Production 1 and Production 2. (Exhibit 32.)
- 72. On July 24, 2025, a second identifiable CDFA employee, Sherita McNair, advised CRLA "there are additional records responsive to" the Request. A true and correct copy of Ms. McNair's July 24 correspondence on behalf of CDFA is attached hereto as Exhibit 34. That same

day, CRLA asked Ms. McNair to "please describe the nature and number of the additional records." A true and correct copy of CRLA's July 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 35. That same day, an unknown CDFA employee responded that the additional records would include "around 300 one-page quarantine releases, similar to the records previously provided." A true and correct copy of CDFA's July 24 correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit 36.

- 73. On August 20, 2025, CDFA released a fourth and final batch of 277 pages of records, Bates_01833-02109 ("Production 4"), 6 months and 28 days after receiving the Request. A true and correct copy of CDFA's August 20 correspondence regarding Production 4 is attached hereto as Exhibit 37. Production 4 contained 275 quarantine release notices issued by CDFA to dairies between November 15, 2024 and March 6, 2025. A representative sample of the records contained in Production 4, Bates_002005 through Bates_002013, is attached hereto as Exhibit 38. CDFA redacted the dairy names and locations, and the names and signatures of some of the agency employees, appearing in Production 4, (Exhibit 38), providing the same justifications it had with respect to its redactions in Production 1, Production 2, and Production 3. (Exhibit 37.)
- 74. Despite CDFA's March 28 and May 2 acknowledgements that CRLA sought "a list or lists" of dairies under quarantine—and despite CDFA's July 2 admission that it creates records containing "the location of H5N1 Quarantined poultry and dairy facilities"—CDFA never produced lists of dairy quarantine locations, or any similar records, and never provided any justification for withholding such responsive records.

CAUSE OF ACTION

Violations of the California Public Records Act [Gov. Code, § 7923.000]

- 75. Petitioner hereby incorporates by reference the allegations contained in each paragraph above and below as though fully set forth herein, and further alleges:
- 76. CRLA is a member of the public, as defined by Government Code sections 7920.515 and 7920.520.
- 77. CDFA is a public agency, as defined by Government Code sections 7920.525 and 7920.540.

- 78. CDFA is obligated to comply with the California Public Records Act, found at Government Code section 7920.000 et seq.
 - 79. CDFA violated its obligations under the California Public Records Act.
- 80. On January 24, 2025, CRLA submitted a California Public Records Act request (the "Request") to CDFA, seeking "any publicly disclosable records maintained by CDFA relating to dairy operations currently or recently placed under quarantine by the state due to H5N1 bird flu cattle infections/exposures."
 - 81. CDFA acknowledged receipt of CRLA's Request on January 24, 2025.
- 82. CDFA failed to advise CRLA within 10 days from receipt of the Request whether the Request, "in whole or in part," sought "copies of disclosable public records in possession" of CDFA, in violation of Government Code section 7922.535, subdivision (a).
- 83. On February 26, 2025, CDFA issued a blanket denial of the Request. On March 12, 2025, CDFA reopened the Request, after CRLA pushed back on its reasons for denial. On February 24 and March 13, 2025, CRLA specified that it sought, at the core of its Request, "a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies under bird flu-related quarantine." On March 17, 2025, CRLA narrowed the Request to information about "dairies that are under active quarantine or that have been released from quarantine in the last two months."
- 84. On information and belief, CDFA maintains records containing lists of outbreak codes for the sites it has placed under quarantine due to zoonotic disease outbreaks; corresponding records containing lists mapping the outbreak codes to the names and addresses of specific dairies, poultries, and other locations where CDFA has established quarantines, i.e., restrictions on the movement and handling of animals and animal products; and records containing maps of sites under quarantine throughout California. On July 2, 2025, CDFA admitted it "immediately" sends dairy quarantine locations to "CDPH and/or to Local Public Health."
- 85. On March 28 and May 2, 2025, CDFA acknowledged CRLA sought "copies of a list or lists of the names and locations of California dairies that are under active quarantine or that have been released from quarantine in the last two months." And CRLA reminded CDFA it sought lists of dairies under quarantine on April 2, July 1, and July 10, 2025. Yet, CDFA never provided CRLA

with a determination that it had decided to withhold the requested quarantine lists, in violation of Government Code sections 7922.535, subdivision (a) and 7922.540, subdivision (a).

- 86. In failing to provide CRLA with a lawful determination and notification that it was denying CRLA's request for quarantine lists, CDFA also failed to "set forth the names and titles or positions of each person responsible for the denial," in violation of Government Code section 7922.540, subdivision (b).
- 87. In failing to respond to CRLA's various requests, arguments, and inquiries regarding its Request over the course of many months, CDFA sought to "delay" and "obstruct" the release of responsive records, in violation of Government Code section 7922.500.
- 88. By engaging in such intentionally obfuscatory conduct, CDFA also failed to assist CRLA "to identify records and information that are responsive to the" Request or the "purpose" of the Request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.600, subdivision (a)(1).
- 89. CDFA similarly failed to provide "suggestions for overcoming any practical basis for denying access to the records or information sought" by the Request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.600, subdivision (a)(3).
- 90. By delaying production of any records for months, ignoring communications from CRLA related to CDFA's failure to produce specific responsive records, and never producing the quarantine lists that CRLA sought, CDFA failed to make the requested records "promptly available," in violation of Government Code section 7922.530, and failed to provide any justification for not producing the quarantine lists, in violation of Government Code section 7922.000.
- 91. Further, even as it eventually identified and acknowledged the existence of some responsive records, CDFA failed to provide CRLA with an "estimated date and time" for receipt of responsive records within 10 days of receiving the Request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.535, subdivision (a). On February 14 and March 24, 2025, CDFA explicitly refused to provide CRLA with an "expected date of receipt" of any records in response to the Request.
- 92. On March 28, 2025, CDFA finally "confirmed that the Department has responsive, disclosable records" related to the Request and provided an estimated date of receipt. Across May

22, July 18, July 23, and August 20, 2025, CDFA released 2,111 pages of records to CRLA (the		
"Records"). The Records largely consist of dairy quarantine entry and release notices, dated		
between August 26, 2024 and April 10, 2025. Although partially responsive to the Request, the		
Records contain numerous impermissible redactions under the PRA.		

- 93. The Records contain the names and signatures of agency officials responsible for placing and removing dairies from quarantine. CDFA partially redacted these names and signatures, claiming their release would "constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy" under Government Code sections 7927.400 and 7927.700.
- 94. Government Code section 7927.400 states: "Nothing in [the PRA] requires the disclosure of records that relate to electronically collected personal information, as defined by Section 11015.5, that is received, collected, or compiled by a state agency." Government Code section 11015.5, in turn, relates only to information submitted to state agencies by a "user," defined as "an individual who communicates with a state agency or with an agency employee or official electronically." (Gov. Code, § 11015.5, subd. (d)(2).) As CDFA employees are not users within the meaning of Government Code section 11015.5, Government Code section 7927.400 has no bearing on whether their names and signatures may be disclosed within public records.
- 95. Government Code section 7927.700, meanwhile, states that the PRA "does not require disclosure of personnel, medical, or similar files, the disclosure of which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." The names and signatures of agency employees are not "personnel, medical, or similar files," and thus Government Code section 7927.700 also provides no justification for redacting such names and signatures contained within public records.
- 96. Because no provision of the PRA supports CDFA's claim that disclosing the names and signatures of agency employees responsible for issuing quarantine entry and release orders would "constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy," its redactions of such names and signatures throughout the Records are impermissible.
- 97. CDFA also redacted the names and locations of all dairies contained in the Records, claiming that, pursuant to Government Code section 7922.000, "the public interest served by not disclosing" dairy names and locations "clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure."

- 98. Because CDFA was unable to show that these name and location redactions were justified "under express provisions" of the PRA, it instead relied on the PRA's catchall exemption, which places a high burden on the agency to justify its withholding or redaction of presumptively disclosable public records by showing that the "public interest served by not disclosing the record clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure of the record." (Gov. Code, § 7922.000.)
- 99. On June 11, 2025, CDFA offered two justifications for its decision to redact the names and locations of dairies from the Records.
- 100. CDFA's stated justifications for redactions do not satisfy the agency's high burden under the PRA's catchall exemption, nor do they overcome the strong public policy of the State of California in favor of disclosure of public records.
- 101. In so variously and repeatedly violating the California Public Records Act, as explained herein, CDFA has demonstrated blatant disregard for the Legislature's dictate that "access to information concerning the conduct of the people's business is a fundamental and necessary right of every person in this state." (Gov. Code, § 7921.000.)
- 102. CDFA has likewise flouted article I, section b, subdivision (3) of the California Constitution, which reads: "The people have the right of access to information concerning the conduct of the people's business, and, therefore, the meetings of public bodies and the writings of public officials and agencies shall be open to public scrutiny."
- 103. At the time of the Request, and through the present, CRLA and other members of the public—including legal services providers, advocacy organizations, public health researchers, members of the media, and, not least of all, dairy workers themselves—have a strong interest in understanding how H5N1 has impacted California dairies and, as such, in exercising their right to examine CDFA's quarantine lists, quarantine entry and release notices, and all other records responsive to the Request, in their entirety and without delay.
- 104. Petitioner lacks any other plain, speedy, and adequate remedy at law to obtain the records sought in the Request.
- 105. This Court should order Respondent to release all records responsive to Petitioner's Request.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays for relief as follows:

- 1. That the Court grant this Petition for Writ of Mandate and order Respondent to immediately produce all records requested in Petitioner's public records request—attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and as clarified and narrowed via correspondence attached hereto as Exhibits 5, 9, and 11—including but not limited to unredacted copies of all lists, spreadsheets, notices, maps, and other documents in Respondent's possession identifying California dairy operations which were under H5N1-related quarantine as of, or which had been released from H5N1-related quarantine within two months of, March 17, 2025; or
- 2. Alternatively, if the Court does not order immediate production of the records as requested, that the Court order Respondent to show cause why such records should not be released, to prepare a log of withheld records, and thereafter to release the requested records; or
- 3. Alternatively, if the Court does not order disclosure and release of the records requested, that the Court conduct *in camera* review of all responsive records for which Petitioner may claim some exemption from disclosure, and thereafter order the same to be released.
- 4. That the Court grant declaratory relief by holding that Respondent violated the California Public Records Act in at least the following respects:
 - Respondent failed to inform Petitioner within 10 days whether Petitioner's public records
 request "in whole or in part" sought "copies of disclosable public records" in Respondent's
 possession, in violation of Government Code section 7922.535, subdivision (a);
 - Respondent failed to provide Petitioner with an "estimated date and time" for receipt of
 responsive records within 10 days of receiving Petitioner's public records request, in
 violation of Government Code section 7922.535, subdivision (a);
 - Respondent failed to provide Petitioner with a determination that its public records request
 was denied with respect to certain records, and certain information within records, sought
 by Petitioner, in violation of Government Code section 7922.540, subdivision (a);
 - Respondent failed to state the "names and titles or positions of each person responsible for" said denial, in violation of Government Code section 7922.540, subdivision (b);

- Respondent failed to provide Petitioner with reasons for its decision to deny Petitioner's public records request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.535, subdivision (a);
- Respondent failed to provide any justification for not producing certain public records requested by Petitioner, in violation of Government Code section 7922.000;
- Respondent failed to assist Petitioner in identifying "records and information that [were] responsive to" Petitioner's public records request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.600, subdivision (a)(1);
- Respondent failed to provide Petitioner with "suggestions for overcoming any practical basis for denying access to the records or information sought" by Petitioner's public records request, in violation of Government Code section 7922.600, subdivision (a)(3);
- Respondent failed to make the public records requested by Petitioner "promptly available,"
 in violation of Government Code section 7922.530;
- Respondent "delay[ed]" and "obstruct[ed]" Petitioner's ability to inspect and copy public records, in violation of Government Code section 7922.500;
- Respondent redacted the names and signatures of public officials contained in public records without proper justification, in violation of Government Code section 7922.000; and
- Respondent redacted the names and locations of dairies contained in public records without proper justification, in violation of Government Code section 7922.000.
- That the Court grant an award of attorneys' fees and costs for Petitioner, pursuant to Government Code section 7923.115, subdivision (a) and/or Code of Civil Procedure section 1021.5;
 and
 - 6. For all other relief that the Court deems to be just and proper.

This is a request, for the reasons below, to reopen and reconsider my Public Records Act request, PID 15289.

Government Code section 7923.600 is inapposite.

CDFA's response to my request states that, "[p]ursuant to Government Code section 7923.600, records related to an open investigation are exempt from disclosure." California Government Code section 7923.600(a) permits documents to be withheld if they relate to the "procedures of, the office of the Attorney General and the Department of Justice, the Office of Emergency Services and any state or local police agency, or any investigatory or security files compiled by any other state or local police agency, or any investigatory or security files compiled by any other state or local agency for correctional, law enforcement, or licensing purposes." This limited exception within the PRA does not apply to the records requested.

Numerous cases make clear that Section 7923.600 does not apply to investigations by state agencies that are disconnected from criminal law enforcement. (See, e.g., Williams v. Superior Court, 5 Cal.4th 337, 356; Cal. ex rel. Div. of Industrial Safety v. Superior Court, 43 Cal.App.3d 778, 783-784.). The records requested do not relate to any investigation carried out for "correctional, law enforcement, or licensing purposes," and are therefore presumptively disclosable.

Balancing under Government Code section 7922.000 clearly favors disclosure.

CDFA's response to my request further states that the Department has made a "determination, based on the facts of this particular case, that the public interest served by not disclosing records related to ongoing H5N1 cattle infection investigations clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure. . . pursuant to Government Code section 7922.000." Such a conclusory finding is likewise insufficient to justify non-disclosure. To rely on California Government Code section 7922.000, CDFA must " [demonstrate] . . . that on the facts of the particular case the public interest served by not disclosing the record clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure of the record" (emphasis added). And " [t]he burden of proof is on the proponent of nondisclosure to demonstrate a 'clear overbalance' on the side of confidentiality." (Bakersfield City School Dist. v. Superior Court, 118 Cal.App.4th 1041, 1045 (citation omitted).)

CDFA has not demonstrated—and will not be able to demonstrate—that the public interest in nondisclosure here is sufficient to overcome the PRA's "strong policy in favor of disclosure of public records." (*Id.*) There is substantial public interest in accessing records which relate to an ongoing <u>public health emergency</u>, including the names and locations of dairies under quarantine where cows and/or workers are infected with a virus that has the potential to cause a pandemic.

Please promptly provide responsive records and/or alternate grounds for partial or complete nondisclosure.

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

Thank you for your continued prompt responses regarding my PRA request, PID 15289. I would ask that you remind your colleagues in the Animal Health and Food and Safety Program of the Department's obligations under the PRA:

"Each agency, upon a request for a copy of records, *shall, within 10 days from receipt of the request*, determine whether the request, in whole or in part, seeks copies of disclosable public records in the possession of the agency and shall promptly *notify the person making the request of the determination* and the reasons therefor. If the agency determines that the request seeks disclosable public records, *the agency shall also state the estimated date and time when the records will be made available.*" (Cal. Gov. Code § 7922.535(a) [emphasis added].)

My initial request was sent on January 24, 2025, more than two months ago, and I have not received an estimated date and time of receipt. After an initial denial, I sent a request to reopen and reconsider my request on March 6, 2025. Even if this constituted a new request, a decision and estimate should have been provided by March 16, 2025. I received a first request for clarification on March 12, 2025, which I read as a determination that there are disclosable public records, but still no estimated date and time for receipt.

California Government Code section 7922.535(b) provides a mechanism by which a "written notice from the head of the agency or a designee" can extend the date of determination by no "more than 14 days," (here, March 30, 2025), but no such notice was given.

It is still my hope to work with CDFA to fulfill my request, but I have been given little reason to believe the Department is diligently working on this matter. On March 17, 2025, I requested rolling disclosure of responsive documents. As an indication of good faith and intent to respond, please, by the end the week, evaluate this proposal and provide estimated date(s) and time(s) for production and/or provide responsive records related to, at least, the 9 California dairies that have been placed under quarantine in the last 30 days, per USDA. 

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment A: Required Biosecurity Practices for HPAI High Risk Commercial Dairy Premises

Quarantined commercial dairy premises will be required to adhere to the following restrictions and conditions:

- Activation of California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) approved Enhanced Biosecurity Plan with initial verification audit.
- Biosecurity training provided to employees of the commercial premises
 - Maintain records of employees trained to include: Name and date of training
- Isolate cows with clinical signs immediately to a hospital pen.
 - Hospital milk must be heat treated to pasteurization standards of 161°F for a minimum of 15 seconds or 145°F for a minimum of 30 minutes prior to disposal
 - 2. Hospital Milk needs to be diverted from human food supply and disposed of in accordance with regulatory requirements.
- Conduct bulk tank and hospital milk sampling at a frequency specified by the IMT. Samples must represent all cattle in milking string within a 24-hour period.
 Collect a minimum of 5-7 mls of milk in screw cap vial. Hospital milk sample must be collected in a separate collection vial than the bulk tank sample(s).
- Cattle Movements:
 - Cattle are subject to the hold order on the quarantine and cannot move off the premises including:
 - Lactating Cattle: including cull cattle, with clinical signs-are not to be moved off premises.
 - No cattle may be moved to a salesyard without a valid permit issued by the IMT.
 - 2. Movement may occur under the following conditions:
 - Non-clinical dry cull cattle: can move directly from farm to slaughter plant establishment without a permit. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 3, section 830 (a)(11) "directly" means moved in a means of conveyance, without stopping to unload while en route, except for stops of less than 24 hours to feed, water, or rest the animals being moved, and with no commingling of animals at such stops.
 - Calves: calves less than 7 days may move off an affected dairy to a specified calf ranch. The calf ranch receiving calves from affected dairy must follow Attachment C: Required Biosecurity Practices for HPAI High Risk Calf Ranch Premises.
 - 3. Special cases may be considered by requesting a movement permit at sfspermits@cdfa.ca.gov

- Conduct daily Active Observational Surveillance for any cattle moved off the dairy for 30 days.
- Movement of Milk: Bulk tank milk from non-clinical cattle can be moved to milk handler following biosecurity practices to minimize risk of disease spread.
- Carcass disposal will follow standard disposal methods and at the discretion of the quarantined premises, pursuant to applicable statues and regulations regarding carcass disposal. If rendering is used, notify CDFA / USDA APHIS Incident Management Team (IMT) and request to be the final pickup of the route, to minimize risk of disease spread.
- Maintain records of all movements on and off the dairy for duration of quarantine and make available to IMT upon request.
- The IMT may revise these conditions at any time based on disease events and risk. Changes will be communicated in writing on a subsequent Amended Notice of Required Action and attachment.
- Conditions for Release of these requirements will be communicated in writing from the IMT

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment B (December Revise): Required Enhanced Biosecurity Practices for Dairies with H5N1

All dairy premises are encouraged to develop and implement an Enhanced Biosecurity Plan. In the absence of a written plan, quarantined commercial dairy premises infected with H5N1 must adhere to the practices outlined below to prevent the spread of the H5N1 virus beyond the premises. A satisfactory audit must be completed as a requirement for the release of the quarantine.

Mandatory minimum requirements:

1. Signage

- Position signage prominently at the entry point of the biosecure area on the premises. In addition, signs must be posted at every human entry into and out of the milking parlor.
- · The signage must state the following:
 - Biosecure Area
 - Proper use of footbath required before entry
 - Hand washing or hand sanitizing requirements
- Signs must be in English and Spanish

2. Footbaths

- The footbath does not need to feature a dip-type bath; it can instead utilize a
 mat or spray system. Set up the station on a concrete surface or a rubber mat
 that can be easily swept or rinsed to prevent dirt or mud from contaminating
 the footwear disinfection area.
- Carefully evaluate traffic patterns in and around the milking parlor, as well as
 areas where animals are fed or housed. Install footwear disinfection stations
 at all human entry and exit points to the milking parlor, near cattle feed
 storage areas (commodity barns), feeding areas (feed alleys), corrals, and
 cattle pathways or alleyways.
- Footwear disinfection stations must be properly maintained, as many disinfectants are rendered ineffective by sunlight, have a limited active lifespan once mixed, or lose efficacy when contaminated with manure, dirt, or mud.
- Use a disinfectant labeled for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (H5N1)
 disinfectant from list provided by CDFA that can be found at
 https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/AHFSS/Animal Health/eprs/docs/HPAIDisinfectantProductsInfographic.pdf

3. Hand washing or hand sanitizing

- Before and after contact with cattle, milk, or related equipment.
- As an alternative wear clean disposable gloves and promptly remove and properly dispose of them after handling milk or cattle.

- 4. Vehicle tire disinfectant (Pump sprayer or pressure washer with disinfectant)
 - Position disinfection stations in front of the milking parlor for the milk truck to clean and disinfect any areas that come in contact with milk as well as tires upon entry and exit.
 - Promptly clean and disinfect any milk spillage from the milk tanker or bulk tank, as milk contains the highest levels of the virus.
 - Minimize human and vehicle cross-traffic with the milk truck, or disinfect footwear, vehicle tires, and equipment when such interaction is unavoidable.
 - Install disinfection stations at all main entrances to the premises where
 vehicles directly route or cross paths with any equipment accessing cattle
 feed storage areas, feed alleys, corrals, or cattle alleyways. Examples include
 feed delivery trucks, shared premises mixing trucks or push-up tractors,
 nutritionists, veterinarians, hoof trimmers, cattle transport trucks, calf haulers,
 deadstock haulers, manure haulers, and milk trucks.
 - Use a disinfectant labeled for HPAI from list provided by CDFA.

** Please note: The virus can survive on footwear, hands, and conveyances for several hours or days, making it easy to spread from one location to another. The above biosecurity practices are critical in minimizing and helping to prevent the spread of the virus. **

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment D: Requirements for Movement of Cattle from State Quarantined H5N1 Infected California Dairies

All classes of cattle on an infected premises (IP) are under a hold order per the state issued quarantine and must have a permit to move off the premises. The quarantine attachment B mandates required biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease off an IP.

All cattle being permitted to move off an IP must be free of clinical signs of H5N1 (HPAI). All movements must have the cattle transported **directly** to their destination. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 3, section 830 (a)(11) "**directly**" means: "moved in a means of conveyance, without stopping to unload while en route..."

Classes of cattle originating on an IP may be permitted for the following movements with destinations in California:

1. Calves:

- a. <u>Heifer calves and replacement breeding bull calves</u> less than 7 days old may move to a specified, state quarantined calf ranch.
- <u>Bull calves</u> may move to a specified, state quarantined calf ranch or be sold to bull calf buyers/dealers.
- c. The quarantined calf ranch must adhere to attachment C that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease and observational surveillance of the calves.
- d. These movements are approved for continuous permitted movement under attachment A and do not need an additional movement permit from the IMT.

2. Young Stock:

- a. <u>Dairy or beef feeder cattle</u> aged 3 14 months may be permitted off an IP to move to any salesyard/market or feedlot in California. There are no quarantines required for the destination premises for this class of cattle.
- b. <u>Heifers moving to a heifer ranch and returning to dairy of origin</u> may be permitted off an IP to move directly to and from a quarantined heifer ranch.
- c. The quarantined heifer ranch must adhere to attachment H that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease and observational surveillance of the heifers.
- d. These movements require a permit from the IMT.

3. Adult Cattle:

a. <u>Lactating dairy cattle or close ups</u> (due to calve within the next 30 days) may permitted off an IP to move direct to slaughter due to an acute injury or chronic

- illness other than that due to H5N1. There are no additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.
- Lactating beef breed cattle may be permitted off an IP to move direct to slaughter or may move to another pasture. There are no additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.
- c. Dry cull dairy cattle, defined as dry for a minimum of 10 days, may:
 - A. Move direct to slaughter establishment. This movement is approved for continuous permitted movement under attachment A and does not need an additional movement permit from the IMT nor additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.
 - B. Be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined California salesyard/market or cattle broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.
- d. <u>Dry cull beef breed cattle</u>, defined as dry for a minimum of 4 days, may be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined California salesyard/market or cattle broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.
- e. <u>Mature dairy bulls</u> may be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined salesyard/market or broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.
- f. The quarantined salesyard/market or broker holding pen must adhere to attachment M that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease, requires that cattle from IP be kept separate from non-infected cattle, and requires cattle destined for slaughter must be green tagged.
- g. These movements, excluding dry cull dairy cattle moving direct to slaughter, require a permit from the IMT.
- 4. All cattle may be permitted to move from one IP to another IP under specified biosecurity conditions that include cleaning and disinfecting of vehicles. The IMT will assess and verify a designated route to minimize exposure to other cattle and poultry premises before issuing the permit. These movements require a permit from the IMT.
- 5. Movement of cattle from a California IP to a destination outside of California may be permitted by the IMT contingent on meeting interstate requirements, Federal Order(s), and obtaining pre-approval from the receiving State Animal Health Official (SAHO). Specific movement conditions will depend on, and be specified by, the receiving state's requirements.
- Movement permits must be requested from the IMT:
 <u>CDFA.SFS Permits@cdfa.ca.gov</u> (See guidance document on how to obtain a permit.). In-state movement permits may take up to 72 hours for approval; out-of-state movement permits may take up to a week for approval.

Failure to comply with the requirements listed in this attachment may result in the IMT revoking the dairy premises' ability to move any cattle off the dairy. The IMT may revise these requirements at any time based on disease events and risk. Changes will be communicated in writing on a subsequent Amended Notice of Required Action and

You requested clarification of the public interest factors CDFA considered when it decided to redact the names and locations of quarantined dairies from the first batch of records it provided to you. Specific information related to HPAI outbreaks and investigations, including names and locations of quarantined dairies, have been redacted pursuant to Government Code section 7922.000, as the Department determined, based on the facts of this particular case, that the public interest served by not disclosing this information clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure. The public interest is served by not disclosing the names or locations of dairies that are under active HPAI quarantine because there are biosecurity risks with releasing the locations to the public. HPAI could be intentionally or unintentionally spread to uninfected dairies and poultry producers if the locations of quarantined dairies are released to the public.

Additionally, the public interest is served by not disclosing the names or locations of dairies that are under active quarantine, or that have been released from quarantine, because maintaining the confidentiality of dairies infected with HPAI encourages producers to cooperate with both state and federal agencies to contain HPAI. The cooperation of potentially impacted producers and producing farming is greatly enhanced when their farm location is kept confidential. Their cooperation protects people, animals, and the food supply. As long as active HPAI virus is detected in the State of California, there is an ongoing emergency and investigation.

I would like to check the status of the second batch of records in response to my PRA request, PID 15289, which were expected to be released by June 15, 2025. And I appreciate receiving the Department's justifications for the redactions. While we do not agree that these factors are sufficient to overcome the strong public policy of the PRA and the Sunshine Provision of the California Constitution in favor of public disclosure of government records, it is helpful to understand CDFA's position.

Before taking this matter to court, we would like to see if CDFA is open to discussing a compromise that would aid worker and public health efforts, without disclosing specific quarantine locations. We propose CDFA do the following as part of its response to HPAI outbreaks and investigations:

- Provide the California Department of Public Health, the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA), and other relevant state and local agencies with up-to-date information about dairies, poultries, and other worksites under quarantine, including names and locations;
- Maintain an up-to-date public webpage displaying county-level data on the number of dairies, poultries, and other worksites under quarantine, along with the number of animals infected or killed by HPAI and containment efforts, similar to such data already published by CDC and USDA for poultries (https://www.cdc.gov/bird-flu/situation-summary/data-map-commercial.html); and

Good morning, Ms. Komar,

Thank you for your responses to my June 17 and July 1 emails, regarding PID 15289. Taken in turn:

Inter-Agency Collaboration

We are glad CDFA has shared data with CDPH, though we have heard conflicting reports about the level of transparency with local health departments. Your response affirms our understanding, however, that CDFA has not shared quarantine locations with Cal/OSHA, the agency most directly tasked with protecting worker health, including from zoonotic ATDs. And we have records from at least one dairy inspection showing that this lack of inter-governmental collaboration helped create the exact kind of biosecurity risk CDFA claims to seek to avoid—inspectors entering a dairy for a preprogrammed inspection without knowing that the site was quarantined. This issue goes beyond the scope of our PRA request, of course, but we hope CDFA takes it seriously and adjusts course.

Public Data

We are happy to provide feedback on updates to CDFA's public reporting of HPAI and similar risks. While this will not satisfy our PRA request, it may aid the public in navigating future outbreaks.

Public Records

Your final response indicates that CDFA is uninterested in working directly with non-governmental actors, including my organization, which certainly reflects the difficulties we have had over the course of this nearly six-month-long PRA request. To that point, we are still waiting on an updated date of release of the "over 800 records" your office identified as disclosable on May 22, 2025.

Your response also implicitly acknowledges that CDFA *has* maintained consolidated lists of locations—and maps—of locations under quarantine, which would naturally be required to effectively respond to an ongoing crisis and share information with CDPH and other partners. If that is the case, then, there is no reason why those lists should not have been identified and released—even with redactions—soon after receiving this PRA request. The only records released so far were an unordered set of notices of entry and release from quarantine, mainly from December 2024.

Finally, I have attached the map presented by Dr. Payne to the Cal/OSHA Standards Board on June 26, 2025. The prominent "CDFA" logo at the top certainly suggests it was based on agency data.

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment A: Required Biosecurity Practices for HPAI High Risk Commercial Dairy Premises

Quarantined commercial dairy premises will be required to adhere to the following restrictions and conditions:

- Activation of California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) approved Enhanced Biosecurity Plan with initial verification audit.
- Biosecurity training provided to employees of the commercial premises
 - 1. Maintain records of employees trained to include: Name and date of training
- Isolate cows with clinical signs immediately to a hospital pen.
 - 1. Hospital milk must be heat treated to pasteurization standards of 161°F for a minimum of 15 seconds or 145°F for a minimum of 30 minutes prior to disposal
 - 2. Hospital Milk needs to be diverted from human food supply and disposed of in accordance with regulatory requirements.
- Conduct bulk tank and hospital milk sampling at a frequency specified by the IMT. Samples must represent all cattle in milking string within a 24-hour period. Collect a minimum of 5-7 mls of milk in screw cap vial. Hospital milk sample must be collected in a separate collection vial than the bulk tank sample(s).
- Cattle Movements:
 - 1. Cattle are subject to the hold order on the quarantine and cannot move off the premises including:
 - Lactating Cattle: including cull cattle, with clinical signs-are not to be moved off premises.
 - No cattle may be moved to a salesyard without a valid permit issued by the IMT.
 - 2. Movement may occur under the following conditions:
 - Non-clinical dry cull cattle: can move directly from farm to slaughter plant establishment without a permit. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 3, section 830 (a)(11) "directly" means moved in a means of conveyance, without stopping to unload while en route, except for stops of less than 24 hours to feed, water, or rest the animals being moved, and with no commingling of animals at such stops.
 - Calves: calves less than 7 days may move off an affected dairy to a specified calf ranch. The calf ranch receiving calves from affected dairy must follow Attachment C: Required Biosecurity Practices for HPAI High Risk Calf Ranch Premises.
 - 3. Special cases may be considered by requesting a movement permit at sfspermits@cdfa.ca.gov

- 4. Conduct daily Active Observational Surveillance for any cattle moved off the dairy for 30 days.
- Movement of Milk: Bulk tank milk from non-clinical cattle can be moved to milk handler following biosecurity practices to minimize risk of disease spread.
- Carcass disposal will follow standard disposal methods and at the discretion of the quarantined premises, pursuant to applicable statues and regulations regarding carcass disposal. If rendering is used, notify CDFA / USDA APHIS Incident Management Team (IMT) and request to be the final pickup of the route, to minimize risk of disease spread.
- Maintain records of all movements on and off the dairy for duration of quarantine and make available to IMT upon request.
- The IMT may revise these conditions at any time based on disease events and risk. Changes will be communicated in writing on a subsequent Amended Notice of Required Action and attachment.
- Conditions for Release of these requirements will be communicated in writing from the IMT

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment B (December Revise): Required Enhanced Biosecurity Practices for Dairies with H5N1

All dairy premises are encouraged to develop and implement an Enhanced Biosecurity Plan. In the absence of a written plan, quarantined commercial dairy premises infected with H5N1 must adhere to the practices outlined below to prevent the spread of the H5N1 virus beyond the premises. A satisfactory audit must be completed as a requirement for the release of the quarantine.

Mandatory minimum requirements:

1. Signage

- Position signage prominently at the entry point of the biosecure area on the premises. In addition, signs must be posted at every human entry into and out of the milking parlor.
- The signage must state the following:
 - o Biosecure Area
 - Proper use of footbath required before entry
 - o Hand washing or hand sanitizing requirements
- · Signs must be in English and Spanish

2. Footbaths

- The footbath does not need to feature a dip-type bath; it can instead utilize a
 mat or spray system. Set up the station on a concrete surface or a rubber mat
 that can be easily swept or rinsed to prevent dirt or mud from contaminating
 the footwear disinfection area.
- Carefully evaluate traffic patterns in and around the milking parlor, as well as
 areas where animals are fed or housed. Install footwear disinfection stations
 at all human entry and exit points to the milking parlor, near cattle feed
 storage areas (commodity barns), feeding areas (feed alleys), corrals, and
 cattle pathways or alleyways.
- Footwear disinfection stations must be properly maintained, as many disinfectants are rendered ineffective by sunlight, have a limited active lifespan once mixed, or lose efficacy when contaminated with manure, dirt, or mud.
- Use a disinfectant labeled for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (H5N1) disinfectant from list provided by CDFA that can be found at https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/AHFSS/Animal Health/eprs/docs/HPAIDisinfectantPr oductsInfographic.pdf

3. Hand washing or hand sanitizing

- · Before and after contact with cattle, milk, or related equipment.
- As an alternative wear clean disposable gloves and promptly remove and properly dispose of them after handling milk or cattle.

- 4. Vehicle tire disinfectant (Pump sprayer or pressure washer with disinfectant)
 - Position disinfection stations in front of the milking parlor for the milk truck to clean and disinfect any areas that come in contact with milk as well as tires upon entry and exit.
 - Promptly clean and disinfect any milk spillage from the milk tanker or bulk tank, as milk contains the highest levels of the virus.
 - Minimize human and vehicle cross-traffic with the milk truck, or disinfect footwear, vehicle tires, and equipment when such interaction is unavoidable.
 - Install disinfection stations at all main entrances to the premises where
 vehicles directly route or cross paths with any equipment accessing cattle
 feed storage areas, feed alleys, corrals, or cattle alleyways. Examples include
 feed delivery trucks, shared premises mixing trucks or push-up tractors,
 nutritionists, veterinarians, hoof trimmers, cattle transport trucks, calf haulers,
 deadstock haulers, manure haulers, and milk trucks.
 - Use a disinfectant labeled for HPAI from list provided by CDFA.

** Please note: The virus can survive on footwear, hands, and conveyances for several hours or days, making it easy to spread from one location to another. The above biosecurity practices are critical in minimizing and helping to prevent the spread of the virus. **

Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment D: Requirements for Movement of Cattle from State Quarantined H5N1 Infected California Dairies

All classes of cattle on an infected premises (IP) are under a hold order per the state issued quarantine and must have a permit to move off the premises. The quarantine attachment B mandates required biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease off an IP.

All cattle being permitted to move off an IP must be free of clinical signs of H5N1 (HPAI). All movements must have the cattle transported **directly** to their destination. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 3, section 830 (a)(11) "**directly**" means: "moved in a means of conveyance, without stopping to unload while en route..."

Classes of cattle originating on an IP may be permitted for the following movements with destinations in California:

1. Calves:

 a. <u>Heifer calves and replacement breeding bull calves</u> less than 7 days old may move to a specified, state quarantined calf ranch.

b. Bull calves may move to a specified, state quarantined calf ranch or be sold to

bull calf buyers/dealers.

- c. The quarantined calf ranch must adhere to attachment C that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease and observational surveillance of the calves.
- d. These movements are approved for continuous permitted movement under attachment A and do not need an additional movement permit from the IMT.

2. Young Stock:

- a. <u>Dairy or beef feeder cattle</u> aged 3 14 months may be permitted off an IP to move to any salesyard/market or feedlot in California. There are no quarantines required for the destination premises for this class of cattle.
- b. <u>Heifers moving to a heifer ranch and returning to dairy of origin</u> may be permitted off an IP to move directly to and from a quarantined heifer ranch.
- c. The quarantined heifer ranch must adhere to attachment H that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease and observational surveillance of the heifers.
- d. These movements require a permit from the IMT.

3. Adult Cattle:

a. <u>Lactating dairy cattle or close ups</u> (due to calve within the next 30 days) may permitted off an IP to move direct to slaughter due to an acute injury or chronic



illness other than that due to H5N1. There are no additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.

b. <u>Lactating beef breed cattle</u> may be permitted off an IP to move direct to slaughter or may move to another pasture. There are no additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.

c. Dry cull dairy cattle, defined as dry for a minimum of 10 days, may:

A. Move direct to slaughter establishment. This movement is approved for continuous permitted movement under attachment A and does not need an additional movement permit from the IMT nor additional quarantine requirements for the destination of these movements.

B. Be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined California salesyard/market or cattle broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.

d. <u>Dry cull beef breed cattle</u>, defined as dry for a minimum of 4 days, may be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined California salesyard/market or cattle broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.

e. <u>Mature dairy bulls</u> may be permitted off an IP to move to a quarantined salesyard/market or broker holding pen for a slaughter only sale.

- f. The quarantined salesyard/market or broker holding pen must adhere to attachment M that mandates biosecurity measures that must be implemented to prevent spread of disease, requires that cattle from IP be kept separate from non-infected cattle, and requires cattle destined for slaughter must be green tagged.
- g. These movements, excluding dry cull dairy cattle moving direct to slaughter, require a permit from the IMT.
- 4. <u>All cattle</u> may be permitted to move from one IP to another IP under specified biosecurity conditions that include cleaning and disinfecting of vehicles. The IMT will assess and verify a designated route to minimize exposure to other cattle and poultry premises before issuing the permit. These movements require a permit from the IMT.
- 5. Movement of cattle from a California IP to a destination outside of California may be permitted by the IMT contingent on meeting interstate requirements, Federal Order(s), and obtaining pre-approval from the receiving State Animal Health Official (SAHO). Specific movement conditions will depend on, and be specified by, the receiving state's requirements.
- Movement permits must be requested from the IMT:
 CDFA.SFS Permits@cdfa.ca.gov (See guidance document on how to obtain a permit.). In-state movement permits may take up to 72 hours for approval; out-of-state movement permits may take up to a week for approval.

Failure to comply with the requirements listed in this attachment may result in the IMT revoking the dairy premises' ability to move any cattle off the dairy. The IMT may revise these requirements at any time based on disease events and risk. Changes will be communicated in writing on a subsequent Amended Notice of Required Action and

- g. These movements, excluding dry cull dairy cattle moving direct to slaughter, require a permit from the IMT.
- 4. <u>All cattle</u> may be permitted to move from one IP to another IP under specified biosecurity conditions that include cleaning and disinfecting of vehicles. The IMT will assess and verify a designated route to minimize exposure to other cattle and poultry premises before issuing the permit. These movements require a permit from the IMT.
- 5. 


